DeVry University has developed this Transfer Guide to assist students transferring from Study.com to DeVry. This guide doesn't represent all courses required for DeVry programs; rather, it provides a list of courses that, when completed at Study.com, may transfer to DeVry. For a complete list of course requirements in each DeVry program, please see the Academic Catalog.

This guide is based on a review of Study.com courses by DeVry as of 9/3/20 and is subject to review and modification at any time and without prior notice. Limitations and restrictions may apply.

This guide is for the following bachelor's degree programs: Business Administration and Technical Management.

Process

Applicants seeking to transfer credit must:

- 1. Request a formal credit evaluation prior to beginning the first class at DeVry University; and
- 2. Provide to DeVry an official transcript from the institution where the credit was earned.

Please contact a DeVry University admissions representative to request a transfer credit evaluation. Prior learning credit is considered on an individual basis and awarded upon receipt of an official transcript only.

Limitations and Restrictions

Admission and prior learning credit applicability are subject but not limited to DeVry University's admission requirements, program requirements and academic policies, including – but not limited to – the prior learning credit policy. Additional state-specific requirements for prior learning credit acceptance may apply.

Notes:

- A grade of C (70%) or higher or the applicable credit recommendation from ACE, NCCRS or the equivalent is required for all prior learning credits to DeVry University. Courses accepted may not be applicable to the academic program chosen by the student.
- The number of credits granted for any course equivalency may not exceed the number on the transcript associated with the transfer course. Credit hours are noted in parentheses after the course title. Study.com courses are 3 credit hours unless otherwise noted.
- Curriculum changes at either institution may affect transferability and applicability of credit. A time limit may be imposed on the ability to transfer credits for some courses, especially those in technical or evolving areas.
- Credit hours for DeVry courses are noted in parentheses after the course title. Study.com courses are 3 credit
 hours each unless otherwise noted. Students must meet the minimum number of credit hours required in the
 program to graduate. If the student does not have the minimum number of credits because of prior learning
 credit discrepancies, additional prior learning credit electives can be applied or electives can be taken at DeVry.
- Students must meet the residency requirement, which is 25% of the program's credit hours. In addition, there
 is a limit of 80 semester-credit hours of lower-division credit (i.e., 100- and 200- level courses) in BSBA and a
 minimum requirement of 42 upper-division credit hours (i.e., 300- and 400-level courses) in BSTM. Therefore,
 all credit earned via Study.com may not be applicable. Additional restrictions may apply.
